With Lugarno dominating possession and playing the game at the opposition end, goal scoring opportunities also fell to Taylah and Jade. As the half progressed Sans Souci continued playing counter-attacking football but the Lugarno defence of Nadine, Charlie, Anastacia and Josephine held firm successfully defusing a number of attacking raids. Mia who had her first game as goal keeper was called upon to make a number of important saves and grew in confidence as the game progressed.

The Saturday before last, the wind carried a biting chill as the team arrived for their 8:50am photos; unfortunately, said photos did not get under way until almost 9:30, which left the kids about 10 minutes to warm up for their game against Arncliffe Aurora on Gannons 4. We started with the slight downhill advantage and dominated the first half in almost all aspects, going ahead after only 4 minutes when Josi cut off a kick that had gone from the Arncliffe goal keeper to their left back, slid the pass over to Andrei on his left, Andrei's shot hit the left corner post and came back out for Josi to pounce on once again and put it away. A few minutes later, Jake sent a great long ball in for Billy to run onto, but the Arncliffe keeper made a good reflex save and stuck out his left hand to deflect Billy's solid shot. Aurora almost equalised in the 14th minute when their marginally off side left wing was allowed to play on and got through one on one with Ben, but he scuffed the shot on the outside of his right foot. Soon after, Andrei ducked and wove through 3 or 4 defenders, but his shot at a very narrow angle was deflected by the keeper. The Arncliffe coach had a considerably different approach to Ocky, telling his team at the half time interval that they were "absolutely pathetic" and telling one of his team that "that's the last time you'll play the striker as long as I'm the coach here". On the resumption, the keeper had swapped out into the forwards.

Arncliffe were applying a bit more pressure in the second half, but our defence was good, with some strong carries of the ball forward. We went ahead 2-0 in the 42nd minute when Nate's high kick from mid field bounced past the defender, and Billy was able to get there and slot a good finish into the bottom left corner.

Unfortunately, 3 minutes later, the ref let another marginal offside go and, running downhill, the Arncliffe striker got through and put his shot away into the top left corner to bring the margin back to one goal. Lugarno continued to play well and came super close in the 50th minute, when Alex and Billy had some nice passes and had some good shots, but with four minutes to go, Arncliffe found some space on the left, raced downfield with our defenders chasing, and fired a shot into the top right corner that Ben could couldn't deflect away.

In the end, a very similar game to many of our previous ones, where we played well out the back, dominated in midfield most of the time, generated some good chances but just lacked that last killer blow, and suffered from some unlucky bounces, marginal calls, and very slight lapses to let our opponents back in.

Our catch up game was against Sans Souci on the following Sunday at the picturesque cricket ground Harold Fraser Oval, an adjunct of Carss Bush Park. Surrounded by a white picket fence, the ground seemed huge from our slightly more removed vantage point, but the weather was less bitter than the day before. the Sans Souci players and (to a lesser extent) their coach. Regular goalkeeper Ben couldn't make this match, which meant that Peter went back into goals and Jake came back into central defence.

In a great sign, Lugarno started strongly once more, and in the 6th minute Josi was able to move Nate's pass on to Billy, who then beat the keeper with a shot into the bottom right of the net. It proved to be the only score of the match, Sans Souci's midfield made better use of possession than many of our other opponents and threatened at times, especially during a 5 minute period in the second half. Lugarno showed great composure and put in a strong effort across with park, with Jake making some great tackles and always dangerous with the free kicks from range, and Jaden was excellent running the ball out of right back. Peter showed good timing to meet some of the long balls coming in, and was solid without (thankfully) needing to do anything spectacular, with Sans Souci's best chance perhaps coming late in the game, when the ball stayed in front of our goal for some time from a corner being kicked around until Sans Souci sent their shot very high and wide. Lugarno had some good chances too, with Alex laying off a great pass to Billy on his right, but the goal keeper was able to parry the shot away and Josi couldn't quite get his boot to the loose ball. A great result and good reward for the performance the team put in. On review of the match sheets, the Association found that Sans Souci had fielded some ineligible players and the result was extended to 3-0 in our favour, adding slightly to our goal differential.

On Saturday July 2nd, we were at Kingsgrove Avenue for the top of the table clash with the ladder leading Bexley North (1) team, whose only loss was way back in Round 1, where we scored a last gasp goal to defeat them 3-2; since then, they had won every game except for a 2-all draw with Sans Souci last Saturday. Winter had eased, but as an early 8:30 game, we had a slight advantage with the angle of the morning sunshine at our backs. With everyone available, Jake started in the backline with Cooper moving out to left back and Alex partnering Josi up forward. The team started brilliantly, with a nice kick into the middle of the park taking a good bounce, which Josi then ran onto and past the last defender to lob the oncoming keeper in just the 3rd minute; all of the boys continued to play really well for the whole half, with some excellent passing and terrific pressure. Bexley North did show dangerous signs coming at our defence in numbers at times, but the back line were usually able to force them to shoot from distance without enough accuracy or direction; the hairiest moment was in the 8th minute, when Ben came out to try and shut down one such move, and the Bombers striker's lob over him bounced up, hit the top crossbar, and popped out. From Ben's goal kick, Lugarno mounted a great counter all the way up the field that forced the Bexley North keeper to come out and kick the ball away, and in the 11th minute, Josi took a throw in from Nate, jinked a couple of times and fired a high shot over the keeper's head from a fair way out to double our advantage. The Bombers continued to press at times, earning some corners, but our midfield controlled possession for a lot more of the time, with Billy and Nate moving and passing well down the wings, and getting dangerous crosses in. In the shadows of half time, Peter made a great run out of defence and fed the ball to Josi once again: his low shot was blocked, but Nate was able to smother the attempted clearance and in the resulting scramble Josi put the ball away for a hat-trick.

The team kept the momentum going after halftime with some substitutions, and another great tackle and run out of defence - this time from Cooper - found Andrei, who switched the ball to Billy; his nice through ball released Josi once again, but the Bexley North keeper was able to come out and parry the shot away; it fell to Nate in good position, and his controlled chip gave us a 4-nil lead in the 34th minute. Bexley North then began to wrest some control away from us in the midfield and apply more pressure, and when our backs got stretched the Bombers were through: despite throwing himself full stretch to his left, Ben couldn't stop the goal from reducing our advantage to 4-1 in the 40th minute. The remaining 20 minutes were a much more even tussle, with both teams making some great runs but with the defences applying enough pressure to prevent any really good shots on goal; the Bombers' best chance was in the 55th minute, when a pass slid across the face of our goal without either of the two Bexley North players getting there quickly enough to tap it in. The score line remained 4-1 at full time.

With all of the away teams winning this weekend, Lugarno is now just the one point behind Saturday's opponents, with the result of our appeal of the draw against the Bexley North (2) side still pending - if the draw stands, we would join the Bexley North (1) side on 31 points but remain second on goal difference.

Sans Souci have had some hiccups, and drop back to a pack of teams vying for 3rd to 6th place separated from each other by only 2 points. The race is very much on!
