With the temperature still in single digits - someone claimed it was just 6 degrees at kick-off time, the top of the table clash saw Lugarno take on Peakhurst who were coming into this game at Gannons Park as the only undefeated team.

A 4-2-3-1 formation was chosen for this crucial game which saw Will start in goals behind a four person defensive unit comprising of Harris, Evander, Jonah and Raffi. The defensive midfielders were Mitchell and Harry, while Peter K, Mitchell T and Peter formed the attacking midfield. The lone striker was Kane. Omar, Stephen, Alex and Issac started on the interchange bench.

Once again there was no official referee appointed for the game but thankfully the home side, Lugarno, was able to appoint a competent referee who knew the rules of the game.

One thing that has become a trademark of the team this year is that they start the games exceptionally well, and this game was no different, with the opening goal arriving within the first three minutes. A clever one-two passing exchange between Peter and Kane resulted in Peter being released in a gap. Using his pace, Peter got to the ball first and found himself on a one on one situation with the Peakhurst goal keeper. The shot was initially saved by the keeper but the support play of Mitchell T resulted in the follow-up shot hitting the back of the nets for Lugarno's opening goal.

The next ten minutes saw Lugarno occupy commanding field position and, on a number of occasions, Lugarno came close to adding to the score line. A combination of great goal keeping and some non-clinical finishing kept Peakhurst in the game. The latter were playing a pressing game and relied on classical counter attacking football. Most of their attack was directed towards Lugarno's left side of defence. One of those counter attacking plays by Peakhurst culminated in their first corner kick in the 17th minute. What looked a harmless corner developed into a danger and a goal, after some hesitant Lugarno defending allowed the ball to pass across the goal mouth, to be kicked in from close range. At 1-1 the game was once again delicately balanced.

Lugarno continued their attacking raids into Peakhurst's half using both flanks and the middle of the park. A number of shots were fired towards the Peakhurst goal keeper with Kane, Mitchell T, Peter K, Mitchell and Peter all going close. With no more goals scored both teams came off the field for the half-time break with the score locked at 1-1.

Second half play did not see any change in the overall game dynamics with Lugarno comfortably neutralising the attacking plays of Peakhurst. Harry, after a determined tackle, ended up securing the ball near half way line and, after combining with Mitchell T, released a wide ball for Peter K who took on the Peakhurst left back then drifted away from him and, from a very acute angle, scored a great goal to give Lugarno a deserving 2-1 lead 11 minutes into the second half.

Positional changes were employed after the goal to help maintain the momentum in favour of Lugarno who came agonisingly close to scoring through Kane, Harry, Alex, and Mitchell T. The Lugarno defence remained alert and solid with Harris, Jonah, Evander, Raffi, being joined by Harry and Mitchell T who were pushed back in the dying moments to provide defensive support.

Both Omar and Stephen played in multiple roles during the game helping to provide vital support to the team while an injured Issac came on for a period in the second half to give some tiring Lugarno players a much needed rest.

After the debacle of the last game this was a great bounce back by the team. It was a win characterised by great determination and focus as Lugarno managed to outplay the co-competition leaders to record a vital win. The score line was close but failed to reflect the true nature of the game. At the end the only reason Lugarno did not end up winning by a much larger margin was due to the efforts of the Peakhurst goal keeper who singlehandedly kept his team in the game.

This was the third time that Lugarno managed to secure a 2-1 win this season and it confirms that the team is able to win close games by remaining focused until the final whistle.
