On an early but still beautifully warm autumn morning, Lugarno lined up on a ground that was still quite soft and a little mushy; without an official referee. Atef from the U11s stepped in to help. Ramsgate managed to exert some early pressure for a few minutes from the kick off, but that was about as good as it got for them, as our team found its way into the contest and then began to control possession and push forward. Saul scored our first goal in the 6th minute after he got onto a through ball, cut back in and beat the 'keeper, and unfortunately the Ramsgate parents felt that it was offside and showed little restraint in yelling out the fact. It did not help when Josi got onto a similar through ball less than a minute later, only to shoot wide. There were a number of no-calls in Ramsgate's favour as well, but each time our defence managed to scramble back and snuff out the attack.
