President's Report 2017

This was my first year serving in the role as President of this wonderful family and community oriented club, having spent the previous four years as club Secretary and previous to that as junior liaison officer. It has been a great honour and privilege to serve the players, team officials, members and supporters and to represent the club within both the football community as well as the wider community.

Season 2017 witnessed 513 players and 102 team officials register with Lugarno FC across 42 teams ranging from the under 6's to the over 45's. Twenty two of these teams comprised of noncompetition teams while the balance comprised of competition teams.

The breakdown of the player demographics shows there were 302 juniors and 211 senior players. The gender profile confirms 409 male and 104 female players.

Ten Lugarno FC teams qualified for finals football comprising of the 12C, 13B, 14GA, 16B, 18A, AAA (1), AAA (2), AAD, AAF and AAG teams. Six progressed to the grand final – 12C, 13B, 16B, AAA (1), AAD, and AAF. Four Lugarno FC teams secured grand final wins and were crowned premiers – 13B, 16B, AAA (1) and AAD. The 16B team also finished as minor premiers. Following the success of season 2017 the number of premierships won by the club has now risen to 112.

The past year has seen Lugarno FC achieve a number of milestones which I would like to briefly share with you.

- The club held a planning day in November to review all operations and activities with the intention of improving them and introducing new initiatives.
- Funding of almost \$10,000 was secured from Georges River Council which allowed the club to invest in new training gear and equipment.
- After a review, the player awards nomination process was rationalised and streamlined introducing a points system to help determine club award recipients.
- An unprecedented seven new sponsors were secured comprising of Ayers Management, Mr Water Plumbing, Magic City Projects, Better Vending Options, Alpha Nobis, PaintCorp and McGrath-Hayden and Olivia Duncan. These new sponsors join the ranks of our long and loyal club sponsors who have contributed to the ongoing success of Lugarno FC on and off the field. Sponsors such as Club Grandviews, Lugarno Deli, Brabond Automotive, Lugarno Cellars, Lugarno Pharmacy, Peakhurst Indoor Sports and Elgas have been supporting the club for a number of years. We thank them for their ongoing support.
- In a new initiative, all registered players received a complimentary training jersey. From now on all new players will receive a complimentary training jersey as part of their registration fee.
- The club invested in state of the art team dugouts, new nets and flag poles and small sided goal posts.
- The school holiday football clinics were reintroduced with great success and feedback.
- A record breaking U8's gala day was held featuring almost 300 players from 36 teams representing 20 clubs from near and distant football associations.
- Lugarno FC aligned itself with the major international sporting brand, Mitre, ensuring the club
 delivers quality gear and in the process became one of the few SGFA affiliated clubs with a
 proper and defined branding strategy.
- In the area of communications, the club launched a Team App that has attracted 200 subscribers and an Instagram page to help enhance its social media presence. Plans are currently underway to launch a new club website by end of November.

- New canteen and field duty procedures were introduced following consultations with team
 officials with the aim of making those tasks and processes more efficient.
- For the first time ever Lugarno FC participated in the FFA Cup, when a joint squad was formed from the club's two All Age A squads.
- Also for the first time ever the club set aside a specific budget for coaching development to
 encourage our team officials to become accredited by attending and completing coaching
 development courses.

At the annual Life Member's Day, six new members were admitted into the ranks of Lugarno FC Life Members. Three involved 25 years of player service to the club and included Matthew Faulkner, Matthew McLoughlin and Mark Lewis. Three others were for provision of exceptional service to Lugarno FC and included former Vice President Warren Woods, veteran coach Mick Barber and former President John Taylor.

Future club plans include changing the field configuration so that Gannons 3, which is currently a midi-field, becomes a main field once again alongside Gannons 6. This change would result in Gannons 4 hosting midi and mini games and would provide a home ground for our under 8's and 9's who currently are forced to play all their games away. The club is also seriously contemplating introducing permanent seating facilities at Gannons Park by investing in mini grand stands.

Lugarno FC raised and actively engaged in a number of constitutional and by-laws matters with the St George Football Association during the season, the most critical being grading and re-grading decisions which impacted on the football fortunes of some Lugarno FC teams; judiciary related matters and representation; overall refereeing standards; and grounds and facilities support and improvement. Engagement with Georges River Council focussed on ground conditions and ongoing improvements and the proposal to install a new light tower adjacent to Gannons 4.

The club also held discussions with the office of David Coleman, the local Federal member for Banks, to ensure that the junior presentation day continues featuring Lugarno FC players receiving the Banks Outstanding Sporting Achievement Awards. Discussions on the state of the grounds, general playing surface, lighting needs and upgrade of amenities at Gannons Park also took place with David Coleman as well as local State member for Oatley, Mark Coure, who pledged to campaign for ongoing improvements for Gannons Park.

Communications with club team players, officials and supporters were conducted by various channels such as the club website, Club Team App, club newsletter, Facebook and Instagram pages with contents being updated regularly, through dedicated email newsletters titled "Lugarno FC Matters" and SMS's for urgent training and game related matters and developments.

The canteen operations had another successful year, with the canteen menu again expanded with the inclusion of new food and drink items ensuring it retained its status as the best canteen in the competition.

All these activities are not possible if we don't have a group of dedicated volunteers who put in numerous hours on a weekly basis for the benefit of Lugarno FC. Having sufficient number of volunteers to conduct the affairs of the Club remains critical for its continued development and success, that is why it remains critical to always have new people volunteer for roles whether it be in an official or formal capacity by serving on the Executive Committee, or in less formal capacity such as volunteering for the various Lugarno FC activities that take place during the regular football season.

A special thank you goes to the 2017 committee members for their ongoing support and love of the club.

Sue Dick performed the role of Club Secretary with distinction and also played a major role overseeing canteen operations. She also helped out with player allocations and team formations and played a pivotal role in all our club activities ranging from the under 6's night to Life Members Day, the under 8's gala day, Trivia Night and club presentation days.

Georgea Theodoridis assisted Sue with the Club Secretarial duties and also was in charge of team issues in her role of Junior Liaison Officer.

Ivan Jersek, as Club Treasurer, kept the club finances in order. Ivan has streamlined and improved the accounting processes and by adopting and utilising electronic payments has significantly simplified the overall club payments processes.

Basil Privitera completed his third year as Club Registrar putting in long hours to ensure players and RTO's were registered for round 1. Basil also assisted with the club photo days, the under 8's Gala Day and other club activities. Unfortunately, Basil has decided to retire at the end of this season which means the club needs to fill this important role. In appreciation for the exceptional work Basil has performed he was awarded the President's Award for season 2017.

Katie White took on the Sponsorship, Communication and Girl's/Women's liaison roles which kept her pretty busy. Katie, who is very approachable, is also an active player with the Lugarno FC Premier Women's League team. She is also project managing the launch of the new club website.

Kristy Parmeter took on the role of Non-comp Liaison Officer and has had a highly successful season. She was in charge of the record breaking U8's Gala Day which was superbly organised and her passion and drive has seen her being assigned other activities such as launching the new club e-newsletter for season 2018.

Suzy Florance and Rebecca Radcliffe, along with Sue Dick, managed the canteen operations. As a result of the commitment and hard work of these ladies, the Lugarno FC canteen operations not only operated successfully but broke all previous records.

Our Grounds Manager, Jarrod Eastwood, who was up in the early hours every Saturday morning during the football season helping teams with their field set-up duties, is also stepping down from the role after this season. We will miss Jarrod and his work ethic.

Club Coaching Director, Michael Apokourastos, has prepared online coaching resources to help junior coaches deliver structured training sessions. Michael also delivered with fellow coaches the highly successful school holiday football clinic.

Atef Elassi continued in his role as Trustee/Equipment Officer, helping to upgrade and modernise the club gear and equipment. He also played an active role in securing new sponsorships for the club and has played a pivotal role in the club's gear branding strategy with Mitre. Atef was nominated for the Lugarno Person of the Year at the prestigious SGFA Gold Medal Awards Dinner.

Georgina Frost, in her role as Social Coordinator, hosted another highly successful record breaking Trivia Night, which is the club's main fund raiser. By focussing on minimising costs and maximising revenue, Georgina has been instrumental in changing the Club's fundraising approach and focus. The other ladies who helped Georgina in organising the Trivia Night which involved weeks of planning and organising comprised of Georgea Theodoridis, Mary Tchamkertenian and Sue Dick.

Maria Radcliffe took on new responsibilities during the season - in addition to preparing the weekly newsletter "Around the Grounds", entering the game scores online and reviewing every team's match sheets, she also prepared the canteen and field duty rosters allocating the responsibilities amongst the various Lugarno FC teams. Maria also continued with her role of finalising player award lists, preparing the end of season report and posting updates to the club's Facebook page.

Mary Tchamkertenian performed her duties as Member Protection Officer and took an active interest in other club activities such as helping out with canteen operations, the U8's Gala Day, Trivia Night, Life Members Day, and club presentation days.

Senior Men's Liaison Officer, Paul McIntyre, helped out with the U8's Gala Day and coached the Women's Premier League side.

At the time of writing this report the Lugarno Executive Committee had met eleven times deliberating on some 161 agenda items covering diverse range of issues.

To all our players, team officials, parents, supporters, and sponsors - thank you for your involvement, support and for being an integral member of the Lugarno FC family. Lugarno FC promotes and advocates the virtues of fun, friendship, families and football.

Going forward, the priority areas for the ongoing development and strengthening of the club remain our juniors and this is an area we must focus on and bolster. It is also important to reduce our overall dependence on registration fees as a source of income by increasing the significance of

other income sources such as sponsorships, canteen operations, gear sales and government grants. Finally, ongoing improvements to the grounds and facilities at Gannons Park are also a priority.

As we reflect on the passing of another successful football season and prepare for the commencement of a new one, no doubt we will be confronted with both challenges and opportunities. It is time for you to continue the proud tradition and consider serving Lugarno FC by becoming a volunteer for football season 2018 and beyond. We have an abundance of tasks, roles and responsibilities both formal and informal. Don't hesitate to express an interest in serving your club as I am certain we have roles and responsibilities that align perfectly with your interests and preferences.

Enjoy the rest of the year and remember to keep an eye out on the new Lugarno FC website at www.lugarnofc.com.au as online registrations for season 2018 will open in early January, and we are encouraging all our players and team officials to register and pay online by end of January to help ease the process of allocating players and team officials to Lugarno FC teams.

Player profile - at this age we really are starting to focus on positions and skills sets which supports our team play. I think this year our players suited their roles and here is my view on how we went this year - starting from the back and moving forward:

Goal Keeper - Noah: This was our first year with a dedicated goal keeper and this was reflected in our results. Goal keeping is a difficult position to play and Noah is a natural. He has excellent timing, hand-eye coordination and no fear, which is essential. Also like most goal keepers, he kept us in the match many times this year. Centre Backs - Alexander and Nathan: My coaching style has

always supported the defense line and our attacking play to start deep in our own half, and we did this very successfully this year. He created a great partnership with Nathan, as Nathan read the game very well, making him very hard to beat as he tackled anything that moved and really locked our back four all year.

Wing Backs - Sean, Daniel C, Dominic and Luke: We really tried to lift this year and change the way we played in this area, and the boys really responded. Sean locked down the left side, was always solid in his defense and also worked 'the long run' and passed up the side line. Daniel's tackling was a highlight this year and he often found himself in one on one positions which he handled very well. With six players from last year's 12B team stepping up into the 13Bs, the side was joined by three players from last year's 13C champions, five other Lugarno Public School friends who had played for Hurstville Zagreb 12B, one returning back from Rugby League and Ocky coming back as coach.

Lugarno started the season with double digit wins against Connells Point and Ramsgate RSL, trying to demonstrate our credentials for a potential promotion into the A-division after the 4th round. In the 3rd round, we met our nemesis for this season, Scots FC, for the first of what would be 5 clashes, and although we logged a big win the following week against ASOW, the 2-2 result in this game

meant that Kogarah Waratah was the side promoted over both Lugarno and Scots into the 13As, where they won only 1 more game to finish 2nd last.

With a renewed focus on our current division, the team went on a strong run over the next 6 rounds, with the only hiccup a 1-1 draw against the Connells Point side freshly relegated from the 13As; this included another 11-nil drubbing of the unfortunate Ramsgate RSL, where we stole the ball from their kick off and scored after 17 seconds and put away another 3 goals in the first 8 minutes. The following week, we met Scots FC for the second time, and although we had the better of the play, we were held scoreless for the first time this season in a 0-0 draw and trailed them by 2 points on the ladder.

At this point, we got a few wobbles: in a rescheduled match against Glory FC at Penshurst Park, we scored 5 goals with clinical finishing, but also conceded 3 goals; and against the Banksia side promoted from the 13Cs, an early lapse allowed them to score and then park the bus, and it wasn't until late that we finally converted our weight of possession to draw 1-1. That result put us 4 points behind Scots and effectively put the Minor Premiership out of reach, even if we beat them in our third home & away fixture. Although we led at the change in that game, a goal against the play sparked Scots on a mini-run where they scored twice more in quick succession, before we got one back to make the final result 2-3 in our first loss. The following week in the last round of the regular season, Glory FC played finals intensity football to outplay us and win that game 1-0, and earn their place in the finals in 4th place.

In the major semi final, we were caught napping and Scots scored early on, and although Lugarno got back into it to control possession and eventually equalise early in the second half, Scots did enough to keep us out for a 1-1 draw, and - as was their right as Minor Premiers - went straight through to the grand final. We were relieved to see that in the 3rd vs 4th minor semi final, Connells Point had knocked out the dangerous Glory FC with a 3-2 result, as our belief was much stronger against Connells (despite Connells' coach's opinion to the contrary); in the elimination final, we posted a strong 5-0 win at Carss Bush Park, despite a late season change in goal keeper because of a foot injury to Eric, one of our regular midfielders.

In the finals series Lugarno faced runners-up Bexley North in the major semi-final on a very windy day. Despite the superior ball possession and field position enjoyed by the opposition, Lugarno's defence held firm and did not allow the opposition to have any clear-cut scoring opportunities. Lugarno ended up playing 20 games winning 15, drawing 1 and losing 4. The team scored 61 goals in the process and conceded 19 for a positive goal difference of 42. In terms of aggregate scores Bexley North proved the toughest opponent with Lugarno averaging 1.3 goals per game and conceding 1.0 goals per game while Oatley proved to be the easiest with Lugarno averaging scoring 5.5 goals per game and conceding 0.5.

Lugarno's 61 goals were shared amongst 13 players with Kane scoring 22 goals, Jordan scoring 13 goals, Danish scoring 6 goals, Peter scoring 4 goals, Harrison scoring 3 goals, Alex, Lachlan, Stephen Omar and Matthew each scoring 2 goals, and Mark, Issac and Mitchell each scoring a goal.

A brief player profile on the premiers follows.

Having been relegated from Premier League in 2016, expectations were high for a successful 2017 season in the AAA competition. AAA(1) 1st Grade – Premiers

Playing in the AAA competition for the first time, we quickly found out that there were not going to be any easy games. While we started with 3 wins and a draw from our first 4 games, our performances were patchy and the intensity levels were below expectations. This was highlighted in Round 5 against Lugarno (2) when we were well off the pace and soundly beaten 3-0. However, this was also the wake-up call the team needed and in hindsight, probably the turning point of our season.

The following week we played Rockdale Suns who were unbeaten and winning games very easily. Even though we went down 1-0, our intensity levels were a 100% improvement and the team showed what was needed to be a force in the competition. After these two defeats, we won our next 5 games to move into a clear 2nd place on the ladder behind the tear-away leaders, Rockdale. We also went down 3-0 to Rockdale in the 2nd round (when plenty of players were missing), but good wins in our last two games had us primed for the finals series.

With a settled team and playing well; we went into the major semi-final against Rockdale with plenty of confidence. However, I don't think anyone expected what happened in the first half. After weathering a strong opening 15 minutes from our opponents, we dominated the rest of the half and goals to Mitch & Jarrod Radcliffe (2), had us 3-0 up at the break. With only 22 players available on the day to cover both grades, we knew it would be tough to hang on in the 2nd half. To the players credit, they battled hard and we controlled the game up until 10/15 minutes to go. But two quick goals to Rockdale saw us facing some anxious moments and we were all pleased to hear the full-time whistle. The 3-2 win saw us as the first team into the AAA Grand Final.

The Grand Final saw a re-match against Minor Premiers, Rockdale Suns, under lights at Scarborough Park. After beating Rockdale 2 weeks earlier, we knew they would be out for revenge. give the game a mighty shake. But it was important to start well as Rockdale had scored early against us in both competition rounds. As in the semi-final, we weathered the early storm and the 1st half was evenly matched, with few clear goal-scoring opportunities. We went to half-time at 0-0, but very pleased with that scoreline.

The half-time discussion was positive, with the focus on maintaining (or even lifting) the intensity for another 45 minutes. The guys started the 2nd half strongly and could have scored in the opening couple of minutes. We totally dominated this phase of the game and for the next 15/20 minutes were camped in their half, but desperate to get that key opening goal. Chris' free-kick was deflected on to the cross-bar and Jarrod's shot was brilliantly saved by their keeper. Rockdale Suns threw everything at us for the last 10 minutes, but the team maintained its composure and we ran out most deserved 2-0 winners.

This was great all-round performance by the team, superior even to our gutsy effort in the semi-final. Every player turned up ready to give 100% and the encouragement the guys gave each-other to keep going was very special. For many players, this was their first experience in finals football at this level. Most of the players had been through the tough times in Premier League in recent years, where the wins had become few and far between. I think this was a real motivating factor for everyone to make sure we made the most of this opportunity to win a competition. And wasn't it great to see so many Lugarno FC supporters there on a cold Friday night to cheer the team on. This really lifted the players who were very pleased to send our supporters home happy.

AAA(1) Reserves - Semi-Finalists

The season started slowly for Reserve Grade, with only one win and a draw from our first 6 games. But our lowly position on the table did not tell the whole story, as we were competitive in all games and unlucky not to have picked up more points. Just like in 1st Grade, we then went on a 6-game winning streak to have the team in contention for a semi-final position. Unfortunately, 2 late season losses against Lugarno (2) and Rockdale meant that we still had to win our last two games to make the finals. This is when the team really stood up and we easily won those pressure games, 4-0 & 5-1, to qualify for the finals in 3rd position.

Down on numbers and with 1st Grade also playing that afternoon, we knew our semi-final was going to be a real challenge against Penshurst West. To their credit, the team turned up ready to play from the opening whistle. Despite losing Eric early on with an ankle sprain and Nick mid-way through the half with an eye injury, we went ahead after 30 minutes when Daniel scored with a cracking header from a corner. We went to half-time up 1-0.

Our bench was barren as the 2nd half commenced, but an early goal to Brandon doubled our lead and gave us hope we could get the win despite all the adversity. Understandably, we tired as the half wore on and Penshurst West began to get on top. Midway through the half it was 2-1 and not long after, it was all even at 2-2. Another injury followed when Bill tore his Achilles tendon and needed to be carried from the field. The guys were fighting hard and with extra-time looking likely, the Referee awarded Penshurst West a very dubious penalty only minutes from full-time. They converted from the spot and our season was over.

This was an incredibly courageous effort from the team to round out a very successful season. With only 4 points after 6 rounds, the thought of even being in the semi-finals seemed optimistic to say the least. But by season's end, the team had proven themselves to be the equal of any other team in the competition. With a little more luck on the injury front, we would surely have at least made it to the 2nd week of the finals. On the positive side, elimination for Reserve Grade allowed us focus 100% on 1st Grade and all players in the squad should consider themselves as part of that 1st Grade Grand Final win.

In summary, this was a great season for the squad. The players enjoyed themselves and really grew together as a collective group as the year went on. Discipline on the field was much improved and given that we didn't have huge squad numbers, this was an important factor in our success. As noted above, the 1st Grade premiership win was a victory not just for the 16 players on the 1st Grade team sheet on Grand Final night, but for everyone in the squad.

Special congratulations to the award winners from the AAA(1) squad. To Jordan Thompson on being the "Outstanding AAA Squad Player", this is a great reward not only for your efforts this year, but also over the past few seasons. Congratulations also to the two Coach & Manager Award winners, Brandon Williams & Tim Faulkner. Brandon was clearly our most improved player and by season's end had become a key component of our 1st Grade team. Tim doubled up most weeks, playing as Goalkeeper in Reserve Grade and on the field in 1st Grade, before taking over as 1st Grade keeper at the end of the season and through the finals series. This year the players also voted for a "Player's Player" award winner within the squad. The runaway winner was Jarrod Radcliffe who captained our 1st Grade team and was inspirational all year, particularly in the big end-of-season games where he scored 4 goals in the two finals games.

We look forward to defending the AAA crown in 2018!!
