President's Report 2018

This is my second year serving as Club President and I am proud to highlight Lugarno FC's achievements this past season continuing on the positive trend set in the previous year.

Lugarno FC achieved the following milestones which I would like to briefly share with you.

- Creation of Coaching Coordinator role to run pre-season skills clinics, school holidays clinics and provide support to Lugarno FC Coaching Director.
- Pre-season skills sessions launched for non-competition players.
- Re-introduced goal keeper training sessions.
- Club LinkedIn account created.
- New club website launched.
- New customised Mitre club gear introduced featuring hoodies, jackets, polos, and bags and customised scarfs.
- Strong increases in player and RTO registrations.
- Introduction of a "welcome day" for all players.
- Eftpos facilities introduced at the canteen to provide payment options.
- Record breaking under 8's Gala Day held featuring 40 teams and almost 400 players.
- Highly successful Trivia Night fund raiser.
- Following intense lobbying, NSW Government announces multi-million dollar program for Gannons Park that will see all fields being re-turfed and irrigation installed.
- New club jersey selected after a competition for jersey designs.
- Skills development pathway proposal which aims to offer talented and aspiring noncompetition players an opportunity to develop and refine their skills submitted to the St George Football Association (SGFA) for endorsement
- Joint funding application submitted with SGFA proposing the construction of a new amenities block for Lugarno FC.
- More than doubled sponsorship income and welcomed CrossFit Hurstville as school holidays football clinic jersey sponsor.
- Signed up with global football brand Umbro to deliver the new Lugarno FC playing strip for season 2019.

Season 2018 witnessed 582 players and 110 team officials register with Lugarno FC representing increases of 13.5 per cent and 7.8 per cent respectively on the preceding season. Lugarno FC fielded 45 teams up from the previous seasons 42 teams ranging from the under 6's to the over 45's. Twenty three of these teams comprised of non-competition teams while the balance comprised of competition teams.

Player demographics breakdown shows there were 327 juniors (increase of 8.3 per cent) and 255 senior players (increase of 20.9 per cent). The gender profile confirms 481 male and 101 female players.

The following Lugarno FC teams qualified for finals football:

• 12A; 12C; 13C; 16B; 16GB; AAC; AAD(1); AAF(2), AAG and PWL.

Three teams progressed to the grand final comprising of:

• 12A; AAC and AAF(2).

Whilst there were no premiership winning teams, the 12A team had a successful season finishing as minor-premiers and participating in the FNSW Champions of Champions tournament. The 16B, AAC, and PWL teams all finished the season as runners-up.

At the annual Life Member's Day, Paul McIntyre was admitted into the ranks of Lugarno FC Life Members becoming the 70th Life Member for Lugarno FC. Paul (Irish) McIntyre has had a distinguished record with the club as a player, coach and past President.

Sadly, the club suffered the loss of two life members Ken Straney, who received his Life Membership in 1974 and was a key figure in shaping the club during the 1970's, and club legend Cyril Henness, one of the original founders of Lugarno FC and who had become Life Member in 1964.

Lugarno FC Life Member and Premier League Coach and Manager Ian Faulkner received the club's Banks Volunteer of the year Award after I nominated Ian for this prestigious award. Other awards that I was able to confer were the SGFA Club Member of the year which went to Non-Comp Liaison Officer Kristy Parmeter, and the Lugarno FC President's award which went to our Social Coordinator Georgina Frost.

Future club plans and priorities include:

- Strengthening junior teams.
- Increasing female participation rates.
- Working with Council, state and federal governments to improve the fields, lighting, constructing a new amenities block, and introducing permanent seating facilities.
- Introducing a skill development pathway for non-comp players.
- Securing new sponsorships.
- Attracting volunteers to fulfil and support club related roles and responsibilities.
- Ongoing engagement with the local community and other key stakeholders.

The club, during the past season, has been very active in lobbying local government representatives as well as State and Federal Members of Parliament. Discussions have focussed on the state of the grounds, lighting needs and upgrade of amenities at Gannons Park.

Club wide communications with players, officials and supporters were conducted by various channels such as the club website, Club Team App, emails, Facebook and Instagram pages.

The canteen, a key club activity, had another successful year raising critical funds to help finance club wide operations and activities.

Naturally all these activities are not possible if we don't have a group of dedicated volunteers who continue to put in numerous hours on a weekly basis for the benefit of Lugarno FC. A special thank you goes to the 2018 committee members for their ongoing support and love of the club.

Sue Dick once again performed the role of Club Secretary with distinction and also played a major role overseeing canteen operations and was part of the Social Committee that organised another successful Trivia Night and club presentation days.

Georgea Theodoridis assisted Sue with the Club Secretarial duties and also was in charge of team issues in her role of Junior Liaison Officer.

Ivan Jersek professionally executed his role as Club Treasurer and was able to report a return to surplus.

Octavio Montoya stepped into the role of Club Registrar and, utilising his IT skills and experience, performed the role exceptionally well.

Katie White, along with Colin Cuthbert, was responsible for Club Sponsorships. Katie also shared the Communications role with Domenic Cuda, who had a pivotal role in launching the new club website and establishing new communication platforms. Katie also had Girls/Women's Liaison responsibilities which kept her pretty busy.

Kristy Parmeter, in her role of Non-Comp Liaison Officer, oversaw a record breaking U8's Gala Day which was superbly organised. She also was in charge of the pre-season Skills Clinics and School Holidays Football Clinics.

Rebecca Radcliffe, along with Sue Dick, once again managed the canteen operations which involves hard work and commitment.

Our Grounds Manager, Giovani Giraldi, was up in the early hours every Saturday morning during the football season helping teams with their field set-up duties.

Club coaching director, Tony Agioski, helped deliver templates of structured training sessions, ran the popular goal keeper training sessions and developed the concept of introducing skill development pathways.

Michael Martinovic, in his role as Coaching Coordinator, helped deliver the pre-season skills clinics and the fun and highly popular school holiday football clinics.

Atef Elassi continued in his role as Trustee/Equipment Officer, helping to upgrade and modernise the club gear and equipment. Once again Atef played an active role in securing new sponsorships for the club and introduced the Umbro brand for season 2019.

Georgina Frost, in her role as Social Coordinator, hosted another highly successful Trivia Night which remains the Club's main fund raising event. The other ladies who helped Georgina in organising the Trivia Night, which involved weeks of planning and organising, comprised of Georgea Theodoridis, Mary Tchamkertenian and Sue Dick.

Maria Radcliffe prepared the canteen and field duty rosters allocating the responsibilities amongst the various Lugarno FC teams. Maria also continued with her role of finalising player award lists, and preparing the end of season report.

Mary Tchamkertenian performed her duties as Member Protection Officer and took an active interest in other club activities such as regularly helping out with canteen operations, the under 8's Gala Day, Trivia Night, Life Members Day, and club presentation days.

Senior Men's Liaison Officer, Michael Jarevski, through his brilliant organisational skills, helped to dramatically increase senior player registrations.

Laura Butcher took on the Recorder responsibilities ensuring game scores were entered by their designated time. She also checked match sheets for errors to ensure Lugarno FC does not attract fines.

At the time of writing this report the Lugarno Executive Committee had met eleven times, deliberating on some 170 agenda items covering diverse range of club and football related matters.

To all our players, team officials, parents, and supporters once again thank you for your involvement, support and for being an integral member of the Lugarno FC family. Lugarno FC promotes and advocates the virtues of fun, friendship, football and families.
